



Pupil Premium Report January 2014

The government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals, looked after children, forces children and other children. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium allocated to schools is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made within the school for these pupils.

Aims

1. Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional educational resources to improve the progress and the raise the standard of achievement for these pupils
2. The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers
3. As far as its powers allow the school will use the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between the children eligible for Pupil Premium and others

2012 -13 Funding

The funds for this year were used to supplement the salary of an extra teacher for literacy and numeracy. This meant that all children, including pupil premium children, were taught for both subjects in classes of less than 20.

Pupil Premium children in Key Stage 2 made expected in writing and mathematics over the year and good progress in reading. Pupil Premium children in Key Stage 1 made expected in writing and reading over the year and good progress in mathematics.

2013 – 14 Funding

Provision	Approx. Cost	Intended Impact
Providing support for basic needs e.g. uniform and PE kit	£200	Pupils have the necessary items/equipments for school
Contributing to the cost of school trips and swimming lessons	£300	Pupils have full access to the extended curriculum, to develop confidence, independence, communication skills and life skills
Providing before and after school care (so parents can work)	£350	Children are at school on time and ready to learn
Funding for SENCO to lead CAF for pupil at risk of exclusion	£700	Pupil Premium child support to remain in school, family supported to access resources to help
TA led sessions to boost/extend pupil premium pupils targeting their specific needs	£1,200	Gap is closing between pupil premium pupils and other pupils. Pupil premium children exceeding age related expectations are challenged and make accelerated progress
TA to lead nurture sessions 1:1 and small group	£1,200	Pupil at risk of exclusion remains in school, other pupil premium pupils have a raised sense of self-esteem
SENCO led sessions to boost progress of pupil premium pupils where attainment is below age expectations	£2,500	Gap is closing between pupil premium pupils and other pupils. Pupil premium pupils move towards age related expectations
Play therapy sessions	£900	Support at risk of exclusion pupils to remain in school
Provision of books/resources to support learning – including the more able	£1,000	Gap is closing between pupil premium pupils and other pupils. Pupil premium children exceeding age related expectations are challenged and make accelerated progress
CPD to meet the needs of the children, e.g communication in the classroom, nurture/therapy training for TAs, dyslexia, dyspraxia training	£3,500	Staff are more qualified to deal with a wider variety of needs so pupils make greater progress with support targeted closer to their individual needs
