



Sports Grant Report September 2014

Principles:

From September 2013 each school will receive extra sports funding through Sports Pupil Premium. In our school this will amount to £8,645 for the academic year 2014/15 and we intend to use it to:

- Improve confidence amongst staff in the delivery of high quality PE lessons across the school through Team teaching from qualified sports providers
- Training for the P.E. coordinator, including developing an assessment system
- Training for children in health and fitness, bikeability, baseline fitness assessments
- Deliver high quality P.E. lessons through TOP SCORE coaching
- Effective provision and use of equipment

We feel that this is the most effective and efficient way for the funding to have a long lasting and positive effect on future learning and physical development of children within our school.
